- **ARC 4000 Directed Independent Study Spring Semester 2022: Mound Bayou Master Plan, Studio Project Book Development, and African American Biblical Church Research.** The objectives of this course are listed as follows:
 - The completion of the Mound Bayou Master Plan originally began in January 2021. The goal of the master plan is to establish a revitalization vision of the future development of Mound Bayou, Mississippi, one of the oldest historic African American communities in the United States.
 - The creation and completion of the Mound Bayou Studio Project Book. This book shall chronical the design and development of a new community and vocational center to be located in Mound Bayou, Mississippi. This design project was born from information gathered during the development of the master plan. A topical studio was created in the Fall Semester of 2021 to design the facility. Though this project is academic, the work of the eighteen students who designed solutions for the project in their Fall Semester 2021 studio will be documented in the book. The book shall be distributed to civic leaders of Mound Bayou, MS, and any stakeholders and supporters of the project.
 - As a subset of my research of the socio-cultural influences upon the architecture of early African American church buildings constructed between 1800 and 1920, this course shall initiate inquiry into Afrocentric biblical origins possibly expressed in placemaking and constructed material culture. The goal is to develop a paper for potential publication.

- **ARC 2546 Architectural Design II-B - Spring Semester 2022.** Studio coordinator of this course. Introduction to fundamental aspects of building including structural-spatial ordering systems. Projects emphasize linkages between people and spaces through investigation of perceptual-conceptual issues. Students will learn various models of spatial organization and will synthesize these principles through a series of architectural design projects throughout the semester.
- **ARC 4623 and 6623 Historic Preservation Research Methods – Fall Semester 2021.** New course to satisfy requirements for awarding of newly established Historic Preservation Certificate offered in the School of Architecture. The intent of this course is to introduce research methodology in general with a focus on the study of historic preservation. The goal is to understand how to identify, assess, and record structures and sites in accordance with historic and current research methods for architectural preservation in the United States.
