In an effort to reduce the amount of boxes being shipped back and forth, we can provide printing services for your photographs if desired.

Printing and Framing Services: Here at MWCP we are a full service custom inkjet printing and framing studio. The prices for print sizes can be found on our website at http://www.mwcponline.com/services.html. We find that our in house printing and framing services help cut the costs of shipping for the artists. If you choose to use our printing services, simply send us an email informing us that you choose to use our services and we will be happy to assemble your work for you, and send an invoice to you via PayPal. We will need high resolution files for printing (300 dpi at actual size), just send the images to our email address info@mwcponline.org by March 27th or at your earliest convenience.

Flat File Feature Format: All photographs should be exhibition quality prints, printed cleanly in a consistent size format, preferably with a considered amount of white space surrounding the images, accompanied with titles, artist statement, and bio information for the flat file feature. Each photographer will have a portfolio consisting of 12 - 20 prints in a separate flat file labeled with the photographers name. If you have a thin portfolio box to present your images in that would be great but not necessary as we have a few boxes in stock here at the gallery. The Light Impressions portfolio boxes are great, and you can find them in a variety of sizes and styles at http://www.lightimpressionsdirect.com/black-portfolio-box-white-lining-11-x-14-x-2/portfolio-boxes/

Shipping of Selected Works: Please have the shipped portfolio delivered to the gallery by March 27. Please send us an email with the tracking number of your package once you have shipped it so we can track the arrival. Please ship your work to arrive during the week before the arrival deadline, although it's great that some artists may have their work ready to ship early, but due to the lack of storage space for boxes we prefer to have all shipments arrive at the gallery about a week prior to the opening of the exhibition, sometime between March 20 - 27.

Artists are expected to cover the round trip shipping costs for their work. Please ship the work in packaging that is easily reusable, and please take care to package the work with plenty of padding to insure safe arrival. Shipping cases are wonderful, and great if you want to invest in something extremely rigid and reusable, here's the Light Impressions version <u>http://www.lightimpressionsdirect.com/transport-shipping-case-16-1-4-x-20-1-4-x-4/transport-cases-portfolios/</u>

Foam lined boxes work wonderfully, we've used the masterpak system before and it's great. Here is their website <u>http://www.masterpak-usa.com/masterpak.htm</u> We have also used similar rigid boxes found at Lowes, and the picture frame boxes at Fed Ex are also great.

Along with your package, include return shipping for the package. For example: Fed Ex or UPS preprinted label, account or card number on a return shipping label, etc. We prefer to use Fed Ex and UPS for return shipments rather than US postal stamps so that we have tracking information.

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Stories We Tell Ourselves Constructed Photographs by Dominic Lippillo

Artist Statement:

During my childhood I lived in fifteen different houses in the Midwest - a part of the country that feels as placeless as the rental houses my family occupied. As a result, I have always felt like an outsider observing and wondering about the area I was inhabiting. Each time we moved I became fascinated and haunted by the residual essence of the former inhabitants that still lingered in and around the home. Throughout the series, "Stories We Tell Ourselves", memory, landscape, and vernacular images, coalesce in a series of constructed photographs. Drawing influence from my experiences, American Scene painting, literature, and cinema; I seek out non-specific American landscapes to become settings that simultaneously feel familiar and unfamiliar. In doing so, I embellish the images by adding atmospheric conditions and appropriated figures that are alien to the melancholic landscapes.

I begin the process for this series by photographing unoccupied suburban and rural areas to serve as backdrops of the everyday. I then search through my collection of anonymous vernacular images – photographs with unknown internal and external contexts – that have been purchased in secondhand shops to find figures to inhabit the minimalistic scenes. In doing so, a pensive human presence appears as an rückenfigur contemplating the landscape for the viewer to identify with, or as a visual device to direct the viewer's gaze around the frame. I approach finding the locations to photograph, and choose the figures to appropriate, with an eye for ambiguity and an irrational attraction and fascination to unassuming details, thus allowing my mind to wander outside of the confines of my eye's visual field.

In these re-contextualized photographic realities, the landscapes and figures share a symbiotic relationship, which allows them to transcend time, space, and experience due to their juxtaposition. By creating composite photographs, I am inviting the viewer to impose new meanings and create their own re-telling's of the stories intertwining the anonymous figures and unspecified locations.

Stories We Tell Ourselves Constructed Photographs by Dominic Lippillo

<u>Bio:</u>

During his childhood Dominic Lippillo's family rented a considerable number of houses. Every time they moved to a new house he would wonder about the uncountable past experiences that may be embedded within the walls, how the former inhabitants used the space, and how their time in this space affected their lives. As a result, he became fascinated by the residual essence of the former inhabitants that still lingered and the remnants they unintentionally left behind that seemed to be discarded, forgotten, or unwanted.

Throughout his projects Lippillo often photographs in or around his personal surroundings in an attempt to understand the spaces and the people who once lived there. In doing so, he creates photographs of experiences that exist in his mind but not in reality. He aims to create and capture fictitious moments, while subsequently calling into question the legitimacy of photographic representation by employing a practice, which utilizes staged photography, found vernacular photographs, and digital composite imagery in which he embellishes the depicted information through a process of addition and deletion.

His work is included in the permanent collections of The Museum of Photographic Art; The Museum of Fine Arts, Houston; The University of Alabama, Tuscaloosa; and the University of North Dakota. Features in publications include *Some Recent Findings, Don't Take Pictures, Mono Chroma, Exposure, Daily Serving, The Eye of Photography,* and *Luminous Landscape*. Grants and Awards include: South Arts Fellowship (2018), Critical Mass Top 200 Finalist (2017 & 2016), Mississippi Arts Commission Visual Artist Fellowship (2016), Mississippi Arts Commission Visual Artist Fellowship (2016), Mississippi Arts Commission Visual Artist Fellowship (2016), Mississippi Arts Commission Artist Mini-grants (2010, 2013, 2014, & 2018), and the Mississippi State University Faculty Research Award (2019 & 2013). Lippillo earned his MFA in Photography from Ohio University (2009) and a BFA in Photography from Youngstown State University (2005), and is an Associate Professor of Photography at Mississippi State University.
