Juror's Statement

Jurying the Americas 2019 All Media exhibition has been a privilege, a pleasure and a challenge. On the occasions that I've seen the All Media exhibition in the past, I have always been impressed with the quality and diversity of the art selected. I was delighted to see that this year was no exception. There were 119 art works submitted, all having merit. It was clear that choosing the recommended 35-40 pieces was impossible. Knowing the scale of the beautiful Northwest Arts Center's gallery I felt we could highlight more.

I juried this show with an eye toward exhibition design in a university gallery asking questions like...What would make a good design, taking into account groupings, complementary pieces and themes? And what would offer students a look at different mediums, unique techniques and disciplined execution? Many wonderful exhibitions could have been developed from the submissions. My only disappointment was I wished for more sculptural work to balance the two-dimensional submissions. I look forward to seeing the chosen work installed.

I was surprised that figurative work was the "standout" category, if I could have included them all I would have. Themes of identity and social justice are evident. Clearly our troubled times are influencing artists and I commend them for using their art to voice concern and communicate stories.

Every juror has a different perspective and regardless of our attempts to be objective–personal preferences do impact selection. Not every selection will please viewers and critics but it is my hope that you will enjoy the 2019 Americas All Media exhibition and appreciate the creative success of each individual art work.

History of Americas 2000

The Americas 2000 juried competitions originated in 1970, when the art faculty at what was then Minot State College in north central North Dakota introduced a juried national exhibition to the art program with the intent of enhancing the visual arts experiences of students, the campus and the regional art community. This original "National Print and Drawing Show" would also provide a source for the purchase of quality contemporary art for a Permanent Art Collection.

In 1976, a gallery space was established in Minot State University's Hartnett Hall for the display of art to the public. The juried competition continued annually and was retitled "Works on Paper" in 1986.

In 1992, a second gallery was added in the new Gordon B. Olson Library, and the Northwest Art Center and its supporting Art Friends membership and board of directors were established to help guide the growing program. The juried competition was opened to international entries in 1993 and became "Americas 2000." In 1995 an all media competition was added.

A "Best of the Best" exhibit featuring best of show artists from the Americas 2000 competitions ushered in the new millennium in 2000, and another helped Minot State University celebrate its centennial in 2013, then toured to galleries across the state.

Forty-eight years after the original call for entries, the Americas 2000 competitions are attracting cutting edge contemporary art from every state in the union as well as foreign countries, with two alternating annual versions, the "All Media" and "Paperworks." We are grateful to the many, many artists who have shared their work and their passion for art with our audiences throughout the years.
